SUBJECT: LPC Meeting Minutes for August 5, 2008

1. The 180th Local Partnership Committee met for a special meeting on Tuesday, August 5, 2008 at 1400 hrs in the Wing Commander's Conference Room.

5. Old Business

A. Late Appraisals – 2 or 3 names were discussed at Key Staff and supervisors were contacted. Names were not given during meeting. **ALWAYS AN OPEN ITEM.**

B. Facilitator Training – Reagan contacted State regarding the needed training. When new training will be held – they will contact us. He also contacted the Group Commanders for facilitator volunteers and none of them responded. He stated that he would forward the issue to Bartman to get some volunteers. **OPEN ITEM.**

C. Drinking Policy – Haas was waiting on a response from State to find out what the existing policy/process was for handling employees who come back to work impaired. Waiting on AIR PEC meeting – no date set for that yet. **OPEN ITEM.**

D. Repairing Smoke Shacks – Giezie was going to contact the 200th RH to find out if they wanted to repair/build new ones as a training exercise. If so, a UFR would have to happen. Also, he was going to research the State’s new requirements on smoke shacks per the new smoking law in Ohio. Giezie was not able to attend the meeting to give a status. This now ties in to the LPC Policy Review open item because LPC 3 is next up for review and is a policy regarding our smoking shelters. **OPEN ITEM.**

E. LPC Members – Dailey's replacement? (i.e. it was stated that Dailey would need to be replaced because of a 7 month TDY) Masiker stated that Management would handle the issue because he didn’t think they were going to replace him. **ITEM CLOSED.**

F. LPC Policy Review – quorum was not met – nothing could be approved – just discussed:

a. LPC 1 – Dress Down Day – Masiker and Linger were going to work on the final draft and present it to the LPC at the next meeting. **OPEN ITEM.**

b. LPC 2 - Extreme Temperatures/Severe Weather – Dohrmann stated that this policy should be temporarily left as is. Instead, they needed to push to the Wing to have Safety develop a Wing instruction. Reagan agreed. Once the instruction is created, this policy will be rescinded. The co-chairs draft a letter to get this policy converted to a Wing Instruction under Safety’s direction. **ITEM CLOSED.**

c. LPC 3 – Smoking Shelters – next to be reviewed. It ties in with another open item that Giezie was working on. The CBA states that good smoking shelters are to be provided/obligated. Are the current structures legal? Todd Copic will research what the new policies of smoking shelters are and bring back them back to the LPC. Also, an email could be sent to Auckman at State asking “we need to build smoking shelters – what is the State law?” Masiker said he would contact Giezie first and have an answer by the next meeting. **OPEN ITEM.**

G. Labor/Management CoP – It was discussed that Tanner at State knows of the CoP’s existence to gain access to our minutes. Word of the CoP will be sent out to the 180FW after all LPC policies are reviewed/updated. **OPEN ITEM.**

H. Fuel Conservation Update – still low on fuel budget (short \$2000 dollars this month and had to send an email out to the Group Commanders to find out what they wanted to do). Good news, we used \$600 less in gas this month but it cost \$1200 more this month for the gas.

a. Recoverable JP-8 – how much is left and can we re-use? Currently using all waste JP-8 for gators or recycle in with A/C fuel. Dohrmann stated that every engine

pull generates about 5 gal of fuel which gets mixed in with other oils/fluids and then dumped in a storage container. They could start keeping the fuel separate for it to be re-used. At this meeting, Kynard pointed out that JP-8 can't be used in GOVs because it would destroy the fuel pumps.

b. Replace Vehicles with LSV/Electric? Zimmerman stated that some units have been provided test vehicles from dealers. He volunteered to contact Selfridge and then some dealers to see if they would possibly do this. He was not at this meeting to give a status. **OPEN ITEM**

c. What about the JP8 used elsewhere (i.e. Hush House, AGE) – if they are getting billed to flying bill – why can't we use the same hand pump to help out against the money used from O&M? It is a mystery of where the \$ is coming from for the hush house/AGE. AGE has to use a lot of fuel by towing eqmt back to pumps and fill up them with JP 8. JP 8 is purchased by fly \$ but can't take AGE eqmt and use fly \$ to fill up. Hence problem. Masiker is still looking into this. **OPEN ITEM.**

d. 4 bikes were ordered for the base. Shops can see them and decide if the base wants to order more.

6. New Business

A. ASA – Guest Steve Nordhaus was brought in to answer any ASA questions that Labor or Mgmt may have. Since Bartman was not able to attend the meeting - it was determined that they would bring Nordhaus back in two weeks to answer the questions. Dohrmann stated they needed to go over what would be expected of technician employees with regards to the ASA mission (i.e. when will the Hydrazine team be needed? Will they get a phone call? Will checklists be developed? What will the ASA procedures be for after hour shifts?). **OPEN ITEM.**

B. LPC 2 - Extreme Temperatures/Severe Weather needs to be replaced with a Wing Instruction issued by Safety. Once this becomes a Wing Instruction, LPC 2 will be rescinded. The co-chairs will draft a letter requesting the above actions. **OPEN ITEM.**
