Old Business:

Issue 2007-04, The issue response was received by the individual who submitted the issue. They were satisfied with the results and findings of the East LPC. This particular portion on The issue is considered closed, although the East Region LPC is opening the issue of transfers under 2008-01. During the work on issue 2007-04 it was stated that HRO was working on policy letter on this subject. The LPC has not seen the policy be put out to field yet. We do not want to lose sight of this matter.

New Business:

Discussed, the new P.T. letter that came out. In this letter it now states that P.T. can be done 3 – 5 times a week one hour per day. Surface Maintenances policy has been 3 times a week 1 hour a day. LPC asked Mr. Markley, for policy letter from SM Office clarifying their stance on this. LPC is not taking this up as an issue at this time pending a Policy letter from SMO.

The East region LPC is losing three members due to transfer to CSMS. We also have one Management member deployed. Remaining LPC members agree that we need to have new members identified by our meeting on 17 July 2008. We may need to contact HRO for IBB training. It was discussed how we could get more bang for our buck on IBB training. Some of the suggestions were:


1. Setup training Semi-annually in advance so techs can plan and take advantage of the training. This would train all technicians in the IBB process.
2. Do training on a shop by shop basis until all shops have had training.

3. Have the IBB training added to new Supervisor training .
The draw back attached to this is only supervisor gets trained.
It was brought up that, having Labor and Management train at the same time and place was a distinct advantage to the training.

The East region Co-Chairs are meeting on 30 April with the Air LPC on Joint LPC for the Rickenbacker FMS 18. This may be a stepping stone for how we do business under Joint facilities. This is not the only joint venture so we need to clarify the workings of joint ventures such as Mansfield, Springfield, and even DSCC.
